Bob Groseth assumed his current position as the Executive Director of the CSCAA after completing 20 years coaching the Northwestern University Men's team. During his tenure, NU finished in the top-12 or better in the NCAA Division I Championships every year from 2004-08, winning five NCAA titles and 30 Big Ten Championships in that time frame.

A three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2002, 2005 and 2007, Bob was named the NCAA Co-Coach of the Year in 2005 in the midst of an on-going string of nine-straight NCAA appearances from 2001-09. Northwestern swimmers earned 71 All-America honors under Bob. This list includes Olympian Matt Grevers, current American record holder Mike Alexandrov and fellow NCAA record holders Bruno Barbic and Kyle Bubolz.

Bob began his college-coaching career in 1974 at the University of Cincinnati. In 1977, he coached at Tulane for one year, before moving to Iowa State for 10 years. Under his tutelage Cyclone swimmers combined to win 41 Big Eight Conference championships. Bob twice earned Big Eight Coach-of-the-Year accolades.
