Bob Miller's highly successful swim coaching career has benefited swimmers for more than five decades. In 1956, Bob co-founded the Olympic Swim School. The Cascade Swim Club evolved from this organization.

Bob coached Cascade Swim Club until 1971. He also coached Totem Lake Swim Team, Pine Crest School, Lake Oswego Swim Club, Bellevue Club and Bainbridge Island Swim Club. Many of Bob's swimmers competed in the Olympic Games; the World Swimming Championships; the Pan American Games, and other international meets. Bob was the U.S. National Team Coach at several international competitions, including the Mexico Pan American Games.

Because of his continued success, Bob was honored as coach of the year in Washington, Florida and Oregon. Bob was honored as Coach of the Year by ASCA in 1973. In his younger days Bob was a member of the USA Modern Pentathlon Team at the 1956 Olympics in Melbourne, Australia. .
