A 1972 graduate of Southern California, Orr has kept Princeton at or near the top of the Eastern Intercollegiate Swimming League. Besides his 17 meet championships, Orr has led the Tigers to either first or second place finishes in 29 of 30 EISL championships coming into this season. Princeton has enjoyed five Top 20 finishes at the NCAA championships under Orr's watch. He has guided the Tigers to 21 Ivy League/EISL regular season championships and 11 perfect seasons.

Entering his 31st season at Princeton, Orr has compiled a very impressive 268-39 (.873) career dual meet mark, including a 231-23 (.909) record in the EISL. Rob Orr is the only swimming coach in program history with more than 200 career wins. Orr has also coached several Olympians and NCAA champions, including 1992 Olympic gold medalist Nelson Diebel '96. His most recent NCAA champion was the 1990 foursome of Mike Ross '90, Ty Nelson '91, Leroy Kim '93 and Erik Osborn '90, who set an American record in capturing the 200-yard medley relay.

Orr has a master's degree in physical education from USC and served as an assistant coach with the Trojan program for three years.
