Current Position: National Head Coach, Singapore Swimming Association.

Peng Siong graduated from the University of Houston in 1985. Under the guidance of Coach Phil Hansel in 1983, Peng Siong achieved the schools only NCCA Division I title in the 50-yard freestyle. In 1982, he was ranked the world's fastest in the 50m Freestyle. He represented Singapore in the 1984 and 1988 Olympic Games.

In 1993, Peng Siong retired from competitive swimming and started a local swim club in Singapore. He has been serving Singapore voluntarily on the National Coaching staff since 1995. Passionately, he believes in creating the right conducive environment for swimming. Over the years of coaching, he began to develop an interest in the area of sports science particularly Biomechanics and Race Analysis.

Since April 2009, Peng Siong is engaged as the National Head Coach by the Singapore Swimming Association. With a humble conviction for success, he works with the sporting fraternity to develop the process. He has taken up coaching roles at the 2000 Sydney Olympic Games, 2004 Athens Paralympic Games, 2008 Beijing Olympic Games and 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games. Coaching highlight – achieved Singapore's 1st Paralympic Gold medal at the 2008 Beijing Paralympic Games.
