Chuck Riggs has been coaching 43 years. He was the Head Coach of the Riverside Aquatics in the 70's and he was the Head Coach of the Redlands Swim Team from 1982-2008. He has produced many high school "All Americans" as well as many national level swimmers throughout his coaching career. He is most known for his World Record holder Sippy Woodhead.

He was a High School teacher for 37 years and he is now retired. He has gone on to pursue coaching at the college level. He is the distance coach for the University of Hawaii and loves it.

In 2008, Chuck was named Southern California Kevin Perry Coach of the Year after his men's team took Junior National Champions. That year, he was the first in the nation to coach two high school swimmers in breaking 20 seconds in the 50 free in the same high school championship meet. He was a featured speaker at the ASCA clinic on distance swimming in 1978.

In college, he was an All-American in 3-meter diving for California State University, Los Angeles and a junior college All-American in both 3-meter and 1-meter diving at Riverside Community College.
